Description

Front: Aufrechter, nach l. schreitender Bär mit Halsband; in Gerstenkornkreis.

Rear: Reichsadler mit nach l. gewandten Kopf, in Wappenschild, auf durchgehendem Ankerkreuz; in Gerstenkornkreis.

Provenience: Altbestand (vor 1871)

Chop mark: A mark of undefined form made normally with a chisel-like tool, for example to test the purity of the core of a coin. It can also be the result of damage caused when the object was found.

Field smoothed: The field of a coin or medal has secondarily been fully or partly deepened in order to improve the relief of the legend or image. This procedure occurs especially with collectors' objects and is not part of the working process of a mint. Not to be confused with the re-cutting of parts of the design or legend on a coin, or the erasure of elements of them.
